### **1. Welcome**

The ILAC Chair, Ety Feller, welcomed delegates to the virtual meeting of the Twenty-Fourth General Assembly of the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (ILAC).

### **2. Program and Arrangements for the General Assembly meeting**

#### **2.2 Housekeeping**

The ILAC Secretary provided a short presentation on the conduct of this virtual session of the ILAC General Assembly. This included advising delegates that they would be requested to confirm their attendance via attendance poll after Agenda Items 4 and 16, advising that the meeting was being recorded for the purposes of generating the minutes and similarly that photos were being taken for the purposes of generating social media and marketing material. Delegates were advised to switch off their camera if they did not wish to appear in these photographs.

### **3. ILAC Chair's Address and Executive Committee Report**

The ILAC Chair presented the *ILAC Chair's Address and Executive Committee Report* provided in the agenda papers. The presentation also covered **Agenda Items 4, 6 and 8**.

The ILAC Chair opened the floor for questions. Further details are available under the relevant agenda items, specifically Agenda Items 6.1 and 6.4.

### **4. List of Decisions taken outside of a convened meeting of the ILAC GA**

The ILAC Chair presented the List of Decisions taken outside of a convened meeting of the ILAC GA as part of the Agenda Item 3.

The first attendance poll was conducted at the conclusion of this agenda item.

### **5. Membership – Status Report**

The ILAC Chair presented the *Members – Status Report to the General Assembly* provided in the agenda papers.

There were no questions from the floor.

### **6. ILAC Administration**

The topics listed under this agenda item were addressed by the ILAC Chair in the presentation provided under **Agenda Item 3**.

#### **6.1 ILAC Secretariat Update**

The following two questions were submitted prior to the meeting and addressed in session. These questions were as follows;

- What is the current status of the implementation of the 2019 ILAC Articles of Association and Bylaws ?
- What impact, if any, has the pandemic had on the operations of the ILAC Secretariat ?

The ILAC Secretary responded to the first question, advising that the Secretariat had been working throughout 2020 to incorporate the new requirements contained in the ILAC Articles and Bylaws into the operational procedures for the Executive and Secretariat and to implement these new requirements as applicable across the whole

scope of ILAC activities. We have also taken this opportunity to make some functional improvements to our management system, keeping in mind the establishment of the single international organisation for accreditation and the future need for the transfer of records and institutional knowledge.

Some of the key changes that many of you will be familiar with, relate to voting and the voting processes and as you know we have launched another ballot this afternoon as we are still seeking to finalise the vacant positions on the Appeals Board. You will have also noted the more stringent measures now in place for confirming the nominated delegates to the GA both for establishing a quorum and for voting.

The decision making process within the Executive committee has also been updated to reflect the more formal requirements in the new revised articles and also the increased level of responsibility, with the Executive now taking membership decisions.

The majority of changes to incorporate the new Articles and Bylaws have been completed, however, we are still finalising the additional updates to the overall management system.

In response to the second question, the ILAC Secretary indicated that the Secretariat staff has been working remotely since the end of March 2020. After initial concerns about the effectiveness of such an arrangement, all of the Secretariat staff have found it to be an effective and for the most part efficient way of working. To mitigate the lack of direct personal interaction amongst the staff the Secretariat has been using the online communication platforms, Zoom and Teams. Weekly Secretariat meetings have been scheduled since the move to remote working where all staff participate for social and work interactions. In addition, these platforms are used to facilitate specific work tasks amongst members of the Secretariat. The NATA Document Management System, which hosts the restricted access ILAC directory, has ensured that all ILAC records are maintained on secured servers while still being available for the Secretariat staff whilst working remotely.

The impact of the differing time zones when working in an international organisation, with members located around the globe, has been highlighted during the pandemic. The challenge of scheduling meeting at reasonable times for as many participants as possible has definitely been interesting and unique. The ILAC Executive Committee is a good example with its members operating across a 19-hour time span. Unfortunately, this means that there are always some joining the meetings very late at night and very early in the morning.

## 6.4 ILAC Document Update

A question was received from Keith Greenaway, ANAB, who sought clarification on the reason for seeking legal advice regarding *PXX:20XX ILAC Policy for cooperation between ILAC Arrangement Signatories* document in relation to Dutch and EU competition law, when ILAC is a global organisation.

The ILAC Chair advised that the ILAC Executive Committee took the decision to seek consultation from Dutch lawyers on the basis that the organisation must comply with

the laws of the country ILAC is registered in, which is the Netherlands. The ILAC Secretary reiterated that this information was disseminated at the 23rd General Assembly held in October 2019.

## **7. Single International Organisation for Accreditation**

The ILAC Vice Chair, Maribel López, who is also the ILAC Co-Chair of the IAF-ILAC Steering Committee for the Establishment of a Single International Organization for Accreditation, presented the *Single International Organisation for Accreditation* presentation to the General Assembly.

## **8. ILAC Liaison Update**

The ILAC Chair presented the ILAC Liaison Update as part of presentation under *Ag Item 03*.

In addition, the ILAC Secretary noted that ILAC has representatives on the working groups undertaking the revision of two key ISO standards used for accreditation under the ILAC MRA: ISO/IEC:17043 Proficiency Testing Providers and ISO:15189 medical laboratories. ILAC has two liaison representatives on each of these working groups.

The ILAC Chair took the opportunity to thank all of the ILAC liaison officers for their work in representing ILAC and reporting to the ILAC members on the activities of our liaison partners.

## **9. ILAC Arrangement Council and Arrangement Management Committee report**

The ILAC AMC Chair, Jennifer Evans, presented the ILAC Arrangement Council and AMC report to the ILAC General Assembly.

There were no questions from the floor.

## **10. Arrangement Committee Report**

The ILAC ARC report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. There was no presentation as the ILAC ARC had not met since the last ILAC General Assembly. The ILAC ARC Chair, Dana Leaman, responded to a question received prior to the meeting as follows:

What is the status regarding actions to incorporate ISO 20387 Biobanking under the ILAC Arrangement structure?

The ARC Chair advised the General Assembly that a working group was established at the ARC Meeting in October 2019 to develop the roadmap for incorporating ISO: 20387 Biobanking under the ILAC Arrangement. The ARC Chair took the opportunity to thank Lorraine Turner for accepting the convenorship of this working group. The first output is expected by the end of 2020 and then following 2020 my proposal to the ARC will be to use that information to develop a project plan on how we begin to incorporate ISO 20387 under the ILAC Arrangement.

## 11. Accreditation Committee Report

The ILAC AIC report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. There was no presentation as the two virtual AIC meetings were scheduled for after the ILAC General Assembly. The ILAC AIC Chair, Erik Oehlenschlaeger, responded to questions received prior to the meeting as follows:

- ILAC G18 is under revision. What does G18 cover and when do you expect it to be published?
- What is the problem with Measurement Uncertainty in sampling? You mention a survey that is inconclusive.

In response to the first question, the AIC Chair clarified that it is planned for ILAC G18 to cover all areas of accreditation covered by ILAC, including Biobanking in the future. It is anticipated that every standard will have its own annex in the document. To date, ILAC G18 has completed a comment circulation within the AIC and the collated comments will be discussed at the virtual AIC meeting scheduled for 15 December 2020. It is too early to say with certainty but there is potential for a 60-day ILAC member comment circulation to be undertaken in early 2021 and then possibly a member ballot mid to late 2021.

The AIC Chair noted that the work on this document has been continuing for the last 4 years and there has already been a significant amount of discussion amongst members on the various issues. Current challenges include the presentation of flexible scopes, noting there is now a definition for flexible scopes in ISO/IEC 17011 and the concerns raised by IEC relating to type testing and the need to detail all of the subtests that are often included in the type testing standards. The AIC Chair noted that the work is progressing and is now being led by the new convenor, Danielle Dicker from NATA.

In response to the second question, the AIC Chair noted that the introduction of measurement uncertainty in sampling into both ISO/IEC: 17025 and the ISO/IEC17011 has led to the current focus on this topic within the AIC. Danielle Dicker from NATA has developed a position paper in an attempt to collect all of the members' views on this issue. It has undergone one revision to date and will be presented at the virtual AIC meetings scheduled for late October 2020. The position paper is not intended to be a guidance document, but it is hoped it will assist members as they work on addressing this topic. The AIC also carried out a survey to collect members comments on several key issues within this topic, however, the results were inconclusive. The survey indicated that there was shared alignment in some areas but not on some critical points, and while we are quite used to discussing how we understand and interpret the wording of certain clauses in a standard there are some new challenges faced with this topic. Some of these challenges include how we serve the market and there is a clear lack of coherence amongst regulators in this area and minimal communication between ABs and regulators in relation to this topic to date. The other challenge faced is that many of our members have not addressed the specific training of the assessors to assess the measurement uncertainty arising from sampling.

The AIC Chair drew the attention of the General Assembly to the Eurachem Guide on this topic which provides some clarity on two aspects, ie the target of the sampling and the sample itself. The AIC Chair used lake sampling as an example where ISO/IEC:17025 dictates the results of a sample from a lake relate to that sample only, as opposed to the target of sampling, which is the lake, and whether or not it is safe to swim in. Whilst regulators rely on the results of accredited testing of the samples that have been taken; it should not be the laboratory that declares the target sample is safe for swimming. The AIC Chair emphasized that this latter issue can really only be resolved by the ABs working with the regulators in their economy. The AIC Chair indicated that these challenges are on the agenda to be discussed at the meeting of the AIC on the 27th of October.

The ILAC Chair opened the floor for questions. There were two comments/questions received:

- EIA Comment: Given that ISO 15189 is currently under revision, it was noted that there may be significant debate if the revised version incorporates the decision rule.
- ESYD Question: More information was requested about the AIC survey on measurement uncertainty in sampling discussed above.

In response to the first comment, the AIC Chair noted that TC 212 WG 1 is working on the producing CD2 of ISO 15189 which should be available by the end of 2020 or early 2021 and when received it will be circulated to the AIC members for review and comment. He further noted that ILAC's proposal to incorporate point of care testing was included in CD1 and appears to be on track for its appearance in the CD2.

The AIC Chair advised, in response to the second comment, that the survey results were circulated in June 2020 to members of the AIC and the survey results were also available in the agenda papers for the upcoming AIC meetings in the document file sharing area.

## **12. Inspection Committee Report**

The ILAC IC report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. There was no presentation as the virtual IC meeting was scheduled for after the ILAC General Assembly. The ILAC IC Chair, Arne Lund, responded to two questions received prior to the meeting as follows:

- Is there a deadline date for implementing the new version of *ILAC P15:05/2020 Application of ISO/IEC 17020:2012 for the Accreditation of Inspection Bodies*?
- Has the WG produced a cross-reference list or other means to identify the changes in the new version of ILAC P15?

The IC Chair indicated the new ILAC P15 document was published with an implementation period of 18 months. As ILAC P15 was published in May 2020 the implementation period will conclude in November 2021.

In response to the second question the IC Chair advised there are three documents available from the ILAC website on the Inspection Committee page, that highlight the changes in the new version of ILAC P15. They include a summary document, containing the changes in the latest version (similar to a cross reference list), a marked-up copy of the new version of P15 showing the changes and a PowerPoint presentation about the related work and the changes made.

At the conclusion of this item the ILAC Chair presented Arne Lund, who concludes his term as the IC Chair at the end of 2020, with a Certificate of Appreciation in recognition of his contribution to ILAC as the Chair of the Inspection Committee from 2015 – 2020. The ILAC Chair thanked Mr. Lund for the time and effort he has put into carrying out this role during his 6 years in this position.

## **13. Laboratory Committee Report**

The ILAC LC report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. The ILAC LC Chair, Jeff Gust, highlighted a few of the key points in his report to the General Assembly.

There were no questions from the floor.

The ILAC Chair thanked the LC Chair on making progress towards the establishment of the Stakeholder Forum.

## **14. Marketing and Communications Committee Report**

The ILAC Acting MCC Chair, Verónica Ramírez, presented the Marketing and Communications Committee (MCC) report to the ILAC General Assembly.

A question was received following the presentation regarding the use of the World Accreditation Day marketing material by the Accreditation Bodies for their own zoom events and if this is permitted by ILAC.

The MCC Chair clarified that all the materials may be used freely, and ABs are permitted to add their logo into the World Accreditation Day marketing material. Requests for different formats can be submitted if required for promotional purposes.

The ILAC Chair also encouraged ILAC members to use the videos uploaded onto the ILAC YouTube channel during World Accreditation Day and also for food related conference events.

## **15 Joint Development Support Committee Report**

The ILAC JDSC report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. There was no presentation as the virtual JDSC meeting was scheduled for after the ILAC General Assembly. The ILAC JDSC Co-Chair, Sharonmae Shirley, responded to two questions received prior to the meeting as follows:

- Given the significant challenges experienced by JDSC members evident from the survey responses, how ILAC can assist?
- Have any Developed Country ABs indicated their willingness to support JDSC members in response to the 2019 JDSC request?

In response to the first question, the ILAC JDSC Co-Chair thanked the ILAC and IAF Secretariats for disseminating the survey and noted that the responses will be discussed at the JDSC meeting planned for November 11. The ILAC JDSC Co-Chair indicated that a number of challenges were listed by the JDSC members who completed the survey including, the disruption of operations, high costs associated with developing an effective IT structure to support remote assessments as well as the general financial impact of the pandemic.

It was further highlighted that with the onset of the Covid-19 pandemic the ILAC Funding Policy should be reviewed to expand the available avenues of support beyond the current scope of supporting attendance at meetings, etc as it has not been possible to utilize these funds as a result of the cancellation of in person meetings during the pandemic.

In response to the second question, the ILAC JDSC Co-Chair indicated that there had been no firm indications of support for the capacity building programs from ABs from developed countries as yet. It was further emphasised that it was still possible to submit expressions of interest to provide support noting that 75% of the JDSC members would like to participate in these programs. Expressions of interest can be forwarded directly to the ILAC JDSC Co-Chair via email or posted in the General Assembly meeting chat area.

## **16. Joint Working Group A Series Report**

The JWG A-Series report to the General Assembly was provided in the agenda papers. The ILAC JWG A-Series Co-Chair, Martha Mejia Luna, responded to two questions received prior to the meeting as follows:

- What is the process to update the FAQs for ISO/IEC 17011?
- Could you share the expected outcomes in 2021?

In response to the first question the ILAC JWG A-Series Co- Chair advised that the questions are submitted by the Secretariats of the regions or through the IAF/ILAC peer or regional evaluation system. A panel of experts/Task Force Group has been established under the JWG A-Series to review the questions and prepare the answers for final approval by the JWG A-Series. The panel members are not limited to the members of the JWG A-Series but the convenor of the group is a member of the JWG A-Series.

In response to the second question, the ILAC JWG A-Series Co-Chair commented that as advised by the ILAC AMC Chair during her report, the Joint Executive Committees have approved the JMC proposal for the JWG A-Series to commence work to define parameters (framework) for peer evaluations of regions and ABs for the duration of the pandemic and to have this document available for implementation by 1 January 2021.

The JWG A-Series has requested the regions to provide any material that addresses how the peer evaluations have been managed during the pandemic and this will provide the initial input into the drafting of the framework document.

A second attendance poll was conducted at the conclusion of this agenda item.
